




Large Item Pick Up

- Large Item Pickup only occurs every 9 weeks as of 2025
- It is scheduled on the same day as your regular trash and recycling collection
- A maximum of 5 large items (such as furniture) and up to 10 bags will be collected from each service address

Compost Sign Up

- The city is accelerating the rollout of compost citywide
- You must sign up for the compost bins
- The signup deadline for the initial round of cart deliveries will be January 10
- Cart selections made after will be delivered on a rolling basis
- Solid Waste will not deliver a compost cart until we receive your cart selection

Apply to the Denver Civil Service Commission

- This position will fill the remainder of a term for a vacated seat and will be eligible to seek an additional term in May 2026. Term lengths are two years with 2 in-person meetings a month.
- The commission is responsible for
 - administering the testing process for entry-level and promotional positions within the Denver Police and Fire
 Departments
 - policy admin
 - hearing disciplinary appeals of classified members
 - endeavors to certify the best qualified candidates for employment
 - promotions who represent the diversity of the Denver community

Near Northwest Area Plan Rezoning

General Information

- The Near Northwest Area Plan (PDF) worked with community members to create a long-term vision to guide growth & city decision-making for the Chaffee Park, Sunnyside, Highland & Jefferson Park neighborhoods
- On January 22, 2024, Denver City Council voted unanimously to adopt the Near Northwest Area Plan
- · The plan is currently in the implementation phase
 - The first step is a city-sponsored legislative rezoning. If approved, the new zoning would lead to development that is consistent with what the community's priorities, as reflected in the plan's vision & goals

Mexico Travel Survey

Sidewalk Ordinance 307 "Denver Deserves Sidewalks"

- Citizen initiated ordinance
- Passed Nov. 2022 with 55.85% support
- Transferred responsibility for sidewalk construction & maintenance to the city
- Annual property fee based on linear footage of property sidewalk
 - Access Fee: Flat fee of \$150
 - Impact Fee: \$3.50 per feet for every foot over 230 feet
- Use the <u>fee lookup tool</u> to confirm your sidewalk fee in 2025
- The sidewalk fee will be included on bi-annual stormwater bills
- Requires development of a sidewalk master plan
- All sidewalks must be fixed, brought to code, and new sidewalks added

Sidewalk Ordinance 307 "Denver Deserves Sidewalks" cont.

- Apply for an instant rebate on your sidewalk fee based on income and household size
- Homeowners already receiving the Solid Waste instant rebate will automatically receive the sidewalk rebate
- Sidewalk repairs are not on-demand, but sidewalk damage reports received by the department are being inspected, triaged, and tracked on DOTI's <u>Sidewalk Repair Map</u>
- You can report "Major Sidewalk Damage" on <u>Denver's</u>

Home Heating Assistance

- Applications are now being accepted for Colorado's Low-income Energy Assistance Program (LEAP)
- LEAP is a federally funded program that helps
 Coloradans pay a portion of their winter home
 heating costs November-April
- LEAP also helps with the repair and/or replacement of inoperable heating equipment



Denver's Snow Angels

- Criteria to be a snow angel include
 - Must be 18 years of age or older
 - Must be a City & County of Denver Resident
 - Must physically be able to visit home sand shovel sidewalk
- Criteria to receive a snow angel
 - Must be a city & County resident
 - Must be an older adult who cannot physically shovel
 - Must be a resident living with a disability

Legislative Initiatives

- <u>24-1373</u> On December 2, City Council voted against rezoning 3719 Wolff Street in the West Highland neighborhood from U-SU-C to OS-B private open space. The rezoning was requested to allow the construction of a private pool club
- <u>24-1591</u> On December 9, City Council voted unanimously in favor of designating the Curie/Dryer Cottage at 4450 Tennyson Street in the Berkeley neighborhood as a historic Denver landmark
- 24-1788 On December 16, Councilwoman Sandoval & Councilman Watson co-sponsored a proclamation honoring The Greenway Foundation for 50 years of dedication to revitalizing, restoring, and reclaiming the South Platte River

Legislative Initiatives

- <u>24-1372</u> On December 16, City Council voted unanimously in favor of rezoning 2258 Perry Street in the Sloan's Lake neighborhood from U-SU-C to U-SU-B. The rezoning reduced the minimum lot size for a single unit dwelling from 5,500 sf to 4,500 sf
- 24-1589 & 24-1590 On December 16, City Council voted unanimously to adopt the 2024 Bundle of Text Amendments to clarify, simplify, and update the Denver Zoning Code. Among the many revisions is the creation of a Minor Detached Structures building form for minor structures such as planters and shed which will not require a zoning permit. The bundle also expands the allowed uses on carriage lots and removes the requirement that the carriage lot owner have their primary residence on the surrounding block
- <u>24-1765</u> On December 16, City Council voted to ban the sale of flavored tobacco which includes e-cigarettes, menthol cigarettes, vapes and other flavored nicotine and tobacco products
